My sinful self my only shame; My glory all the cross

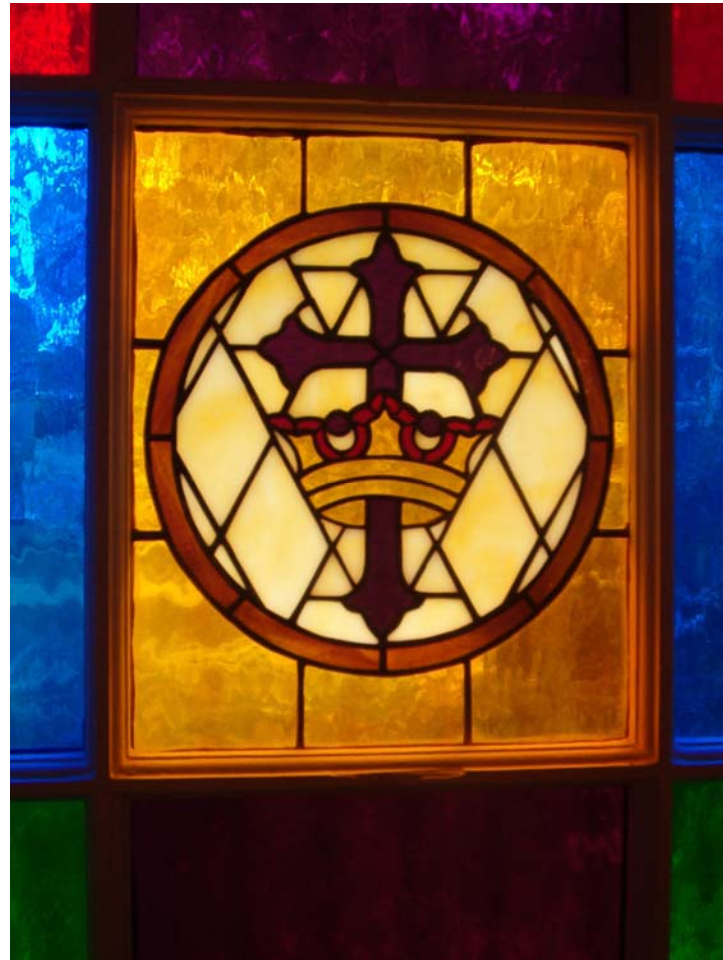
Suffering, an evil or a tool?



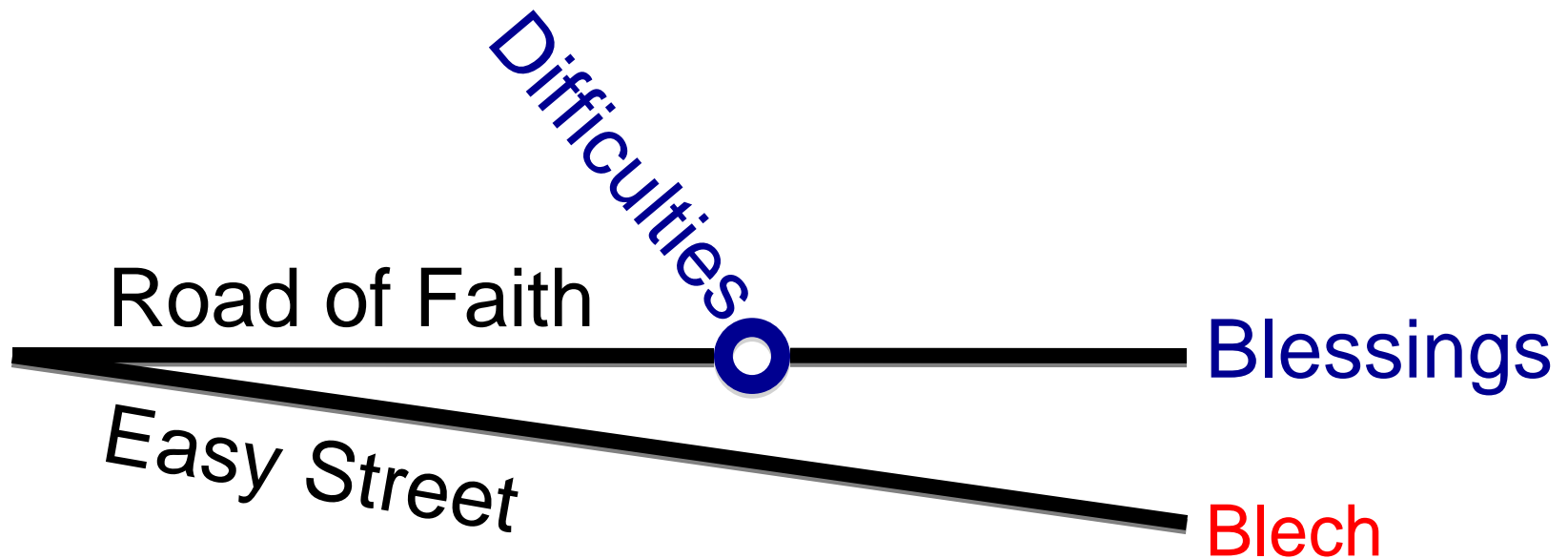
Remember what is coming on the

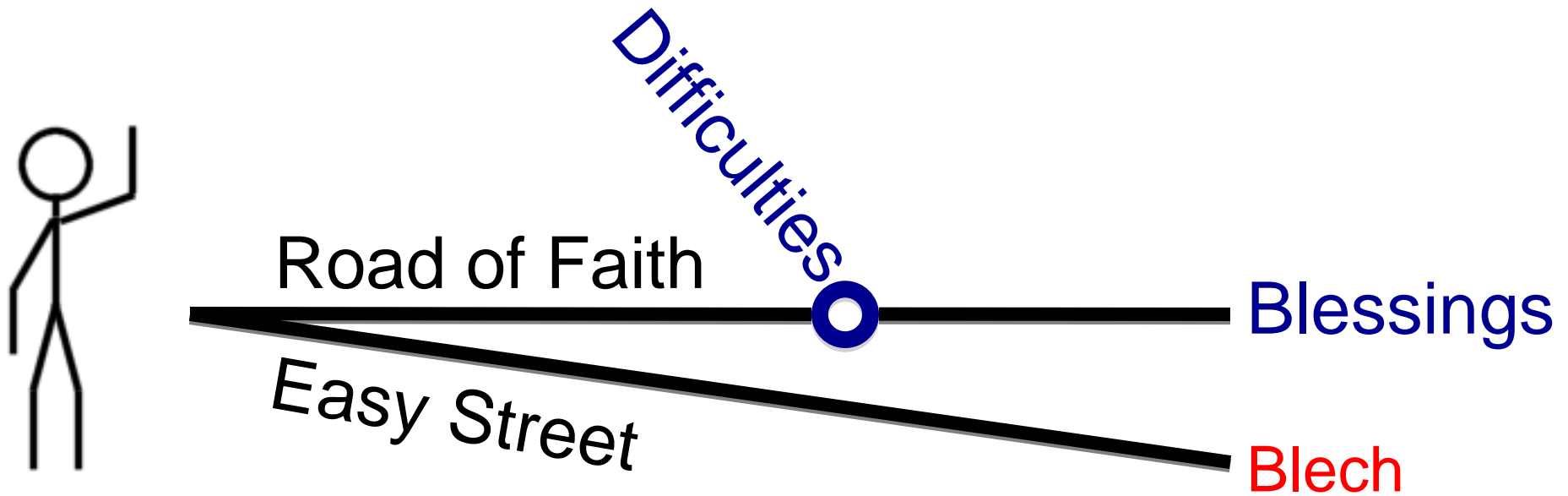

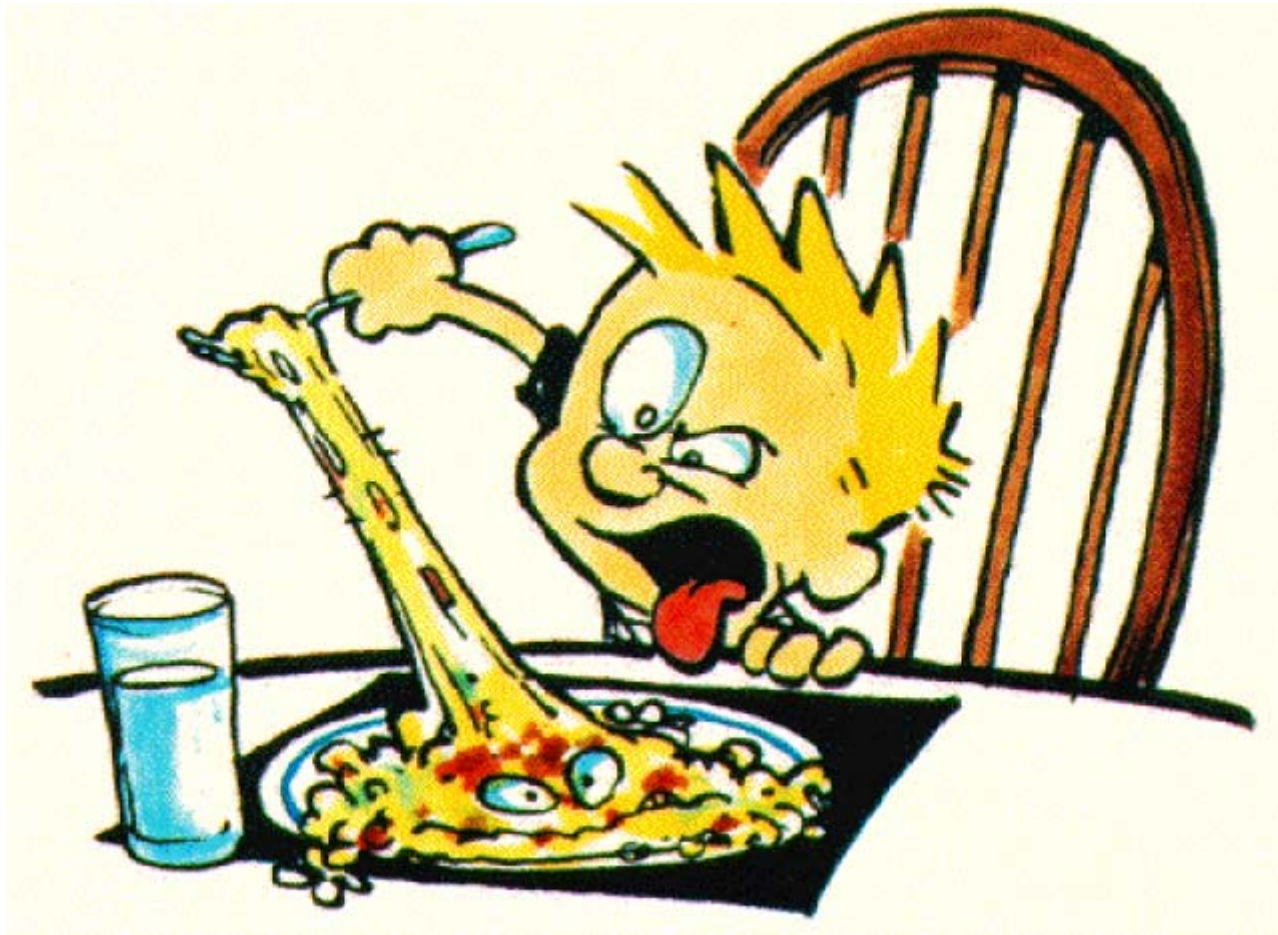

Stay busy, there is lots to do!



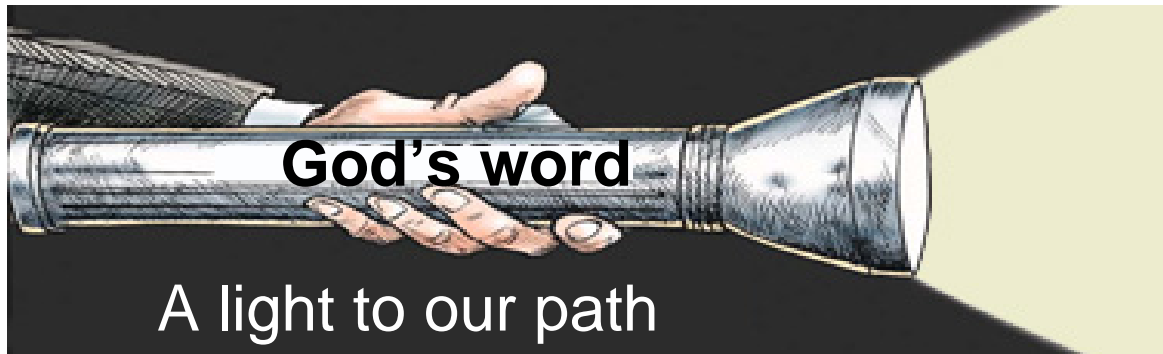
