





Philippi was largely a Gentile congregation




Remember the Philippian jailor




Luke was tied closely to Philippi

Paul's confidence in God's work




Paul's imprisonment was for the good

Work out what God is working in



Paul could out-brag anyone, if it really mattered






Press on toward the goal

Rejoice in the Lord always!




Choose prayer over worry!

Think about things true, honorable, pure, lovely and good




