






We need to remember Paul's training!

From the Babylonian Talmud: From the Torah, the Prophets, and the Holy Writings, it is shown that on the way on which a person wants to go - in that way he is led. From the Torah, Num 22:12 And God said to Balaam, You shall not go with them", and then: "if the men came to call you, rise up and go with Num 22:20 them"; the Prophets: "I am the Lord your God who teaches you for your profit, Isa. 48:17 who leads you by the way that you should go"; and the Holy Writings: "If he is of the scorners, he will be allowed to Prov. 3:34 speak scorn, and if he is of the meek, he will show forth grace".

Rabbi Jesus 1 Sam 21 **Ex 25** Lev. 24 Num 28 Hag. 2 Hos 6 Mic 6

He said to them, "Have you not read what David did when he was hungry, and those who were with him: how he entered the house of God and ate the bread of the Presence, which it was not lawful for him to eat nor for those who were with him, but only for the priests? Or have you not read in the Law how on the Sabbath the priests in the temple profane the Sabbath and are guiltless? I tell you, something greater than the temple is here. And if you had known what this means, 'I desire mercy, and not sacrifice,' you would not have condemned the guiltless." (Mt. 1つ・2_7)

This is called "*haraz*" meaning "stringing together pearls"









"Typology" – Something in Old Testament is a type or model of something in the New Testament



Typology ("model")

"Therefore let no one pass judgment on you ... with regard to a festival ... These are a shadow of the things to come, but the substance belongs to Christ" (Col. 2:16-17)






Typology ("model") "Our fathers ... passed through the sea... and were baptized into Moses" (1 Cor 10:1-2)











Analogy ("compare")

For Moses writes about the righteousness that is based on the law... But the righteousness based on faith says, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?" (that is, to bring Christ down) or "Who will descend into the abyss?" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. (Rom 10)
