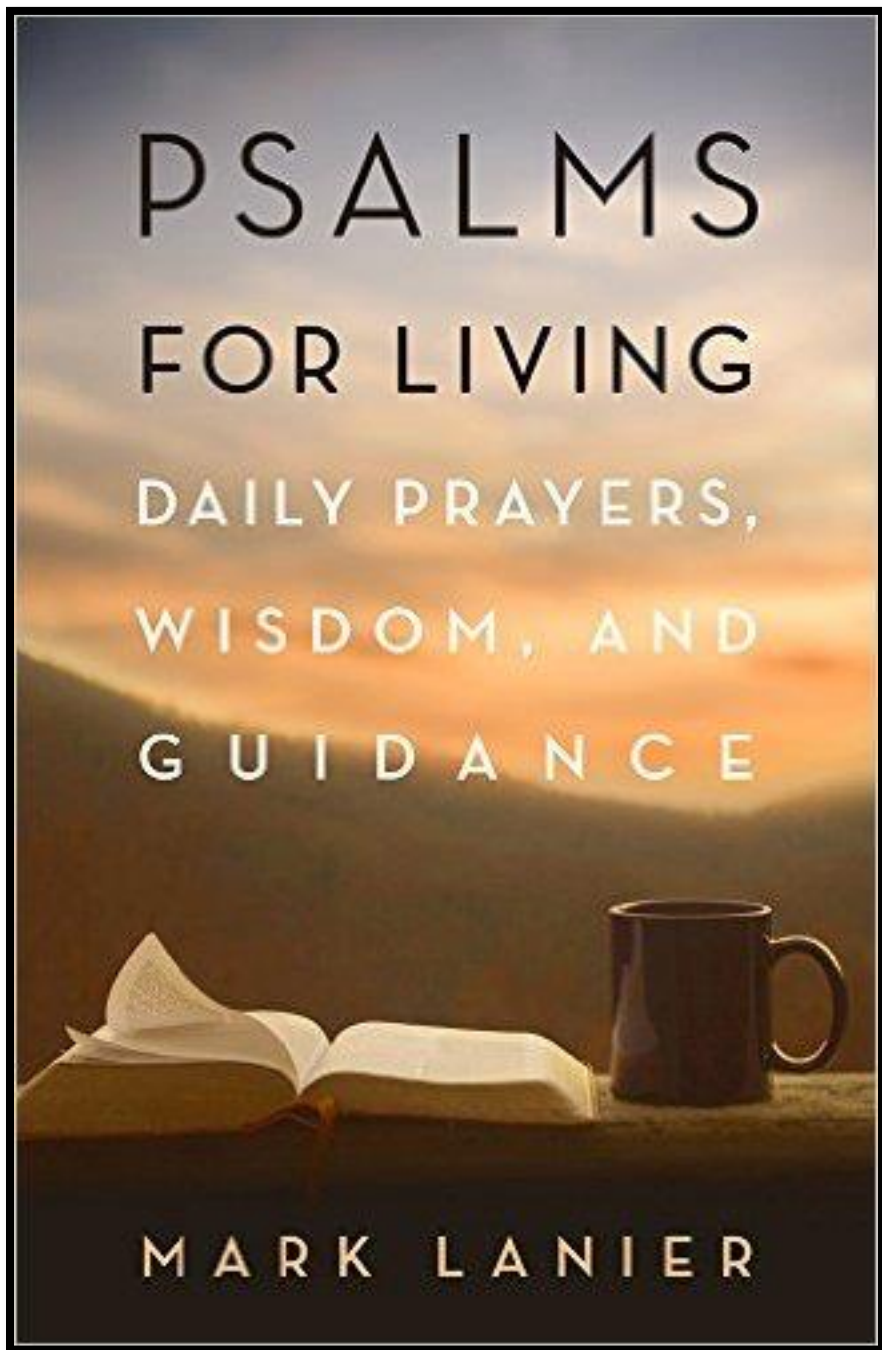

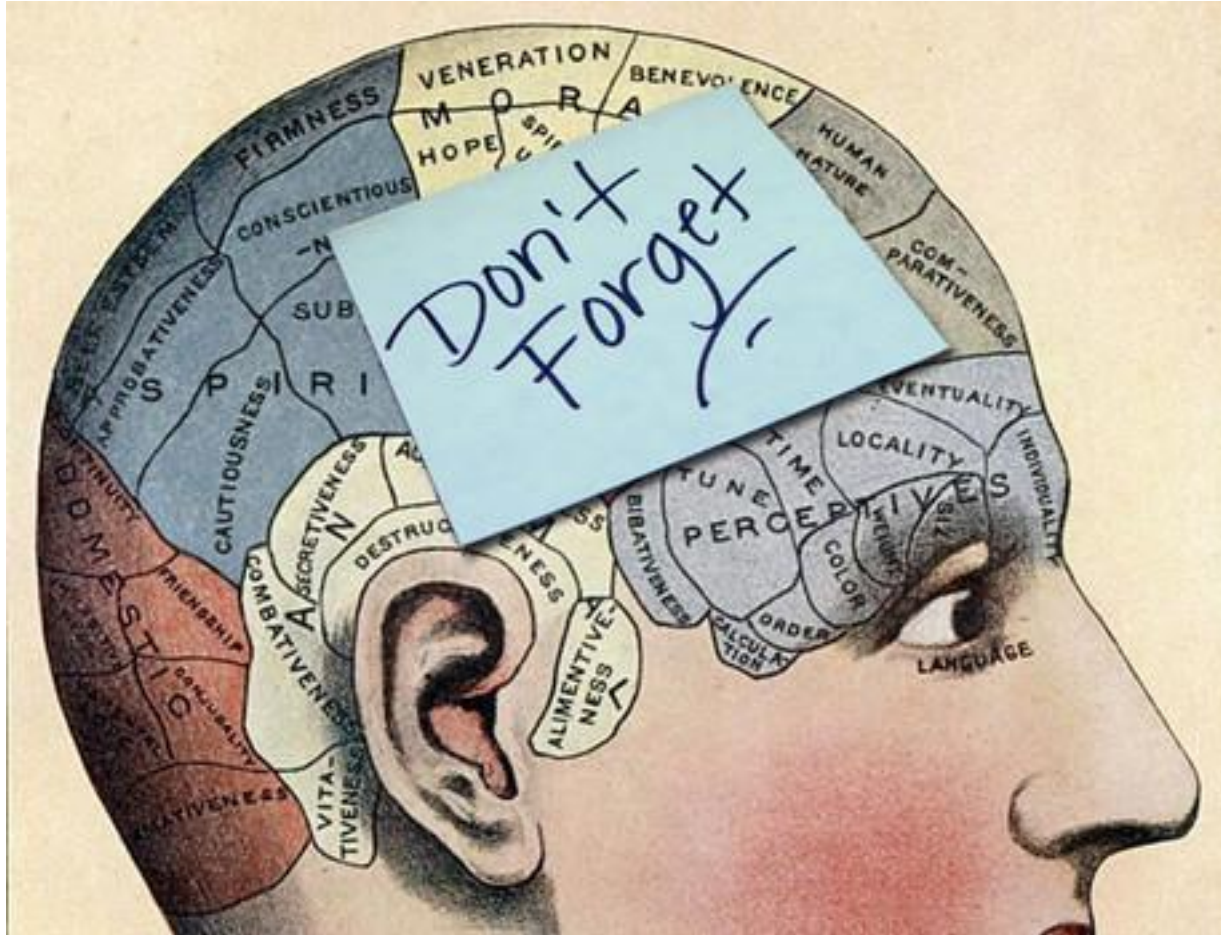

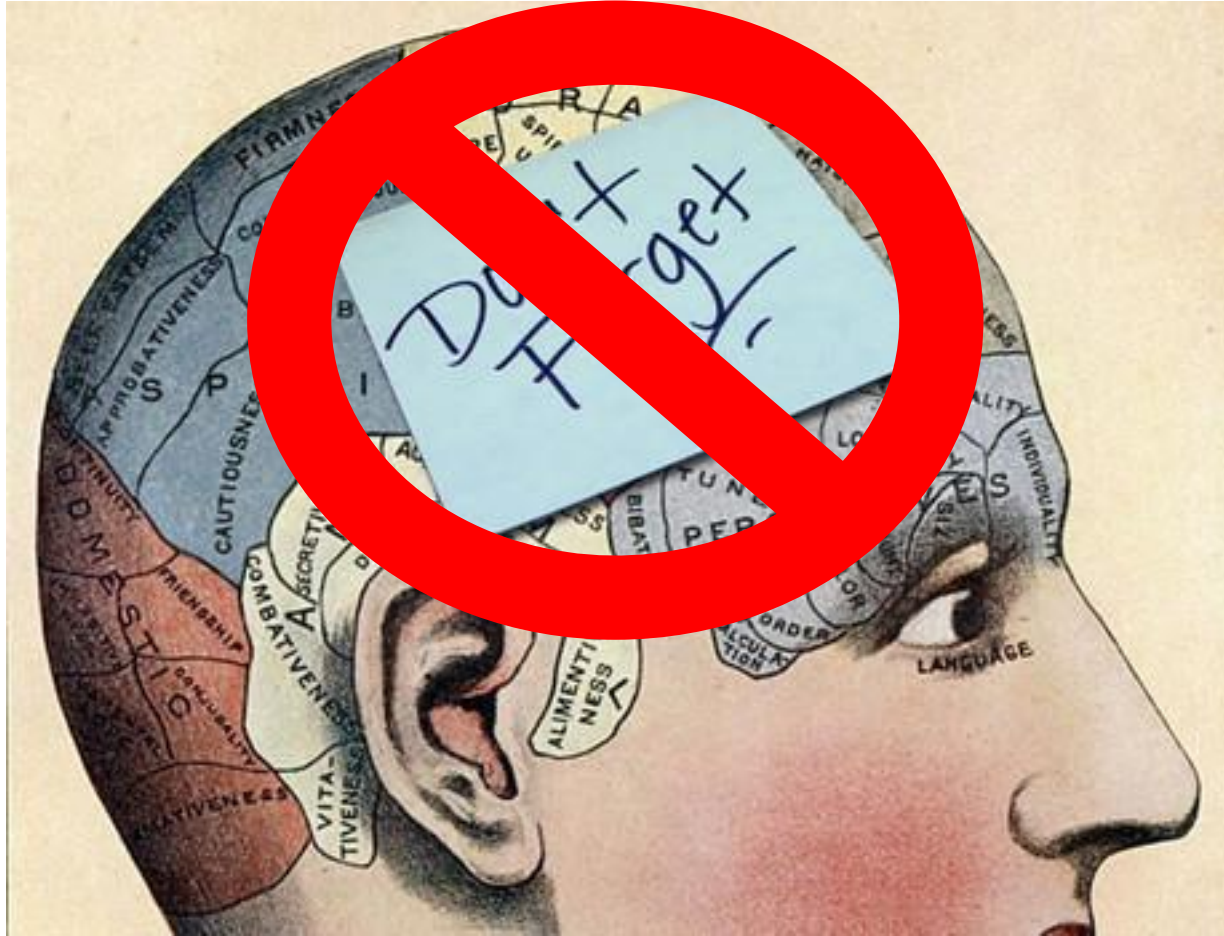
HUMILITY

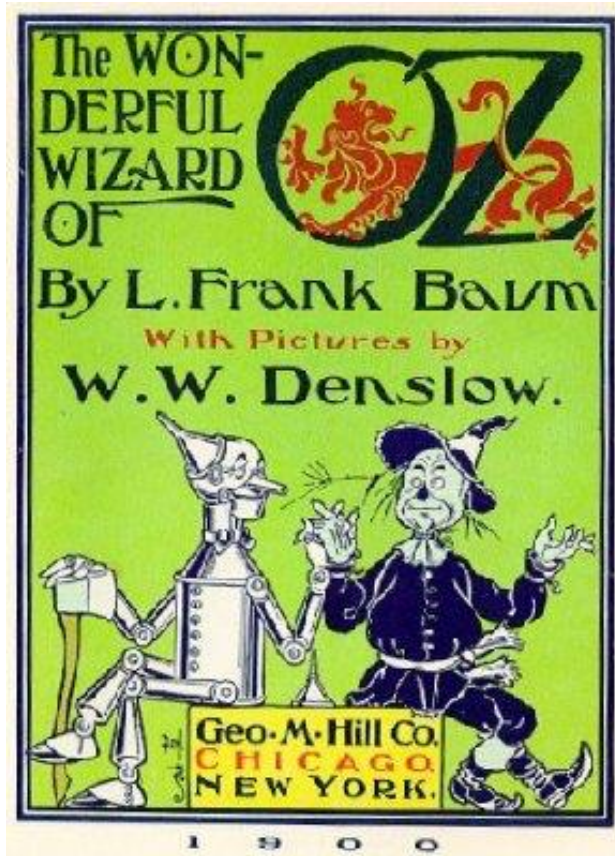
