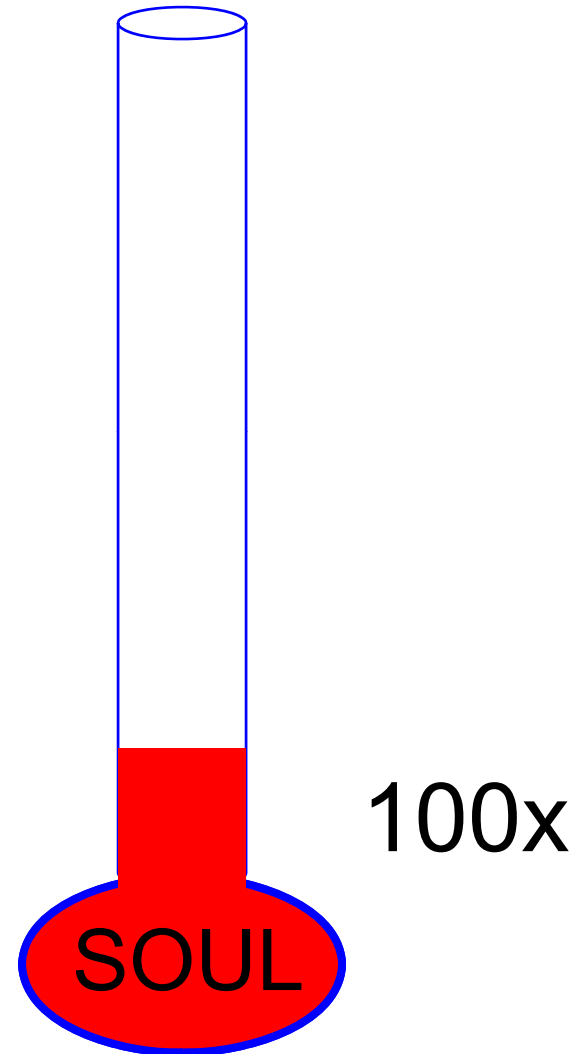
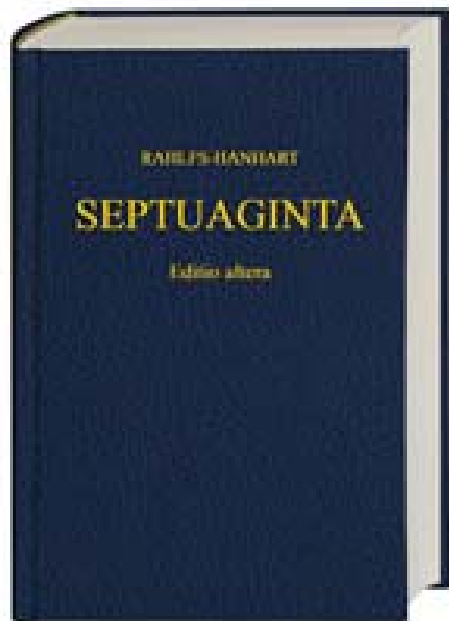
The Septuagint (“LXX”)
gives us Hebrew insight



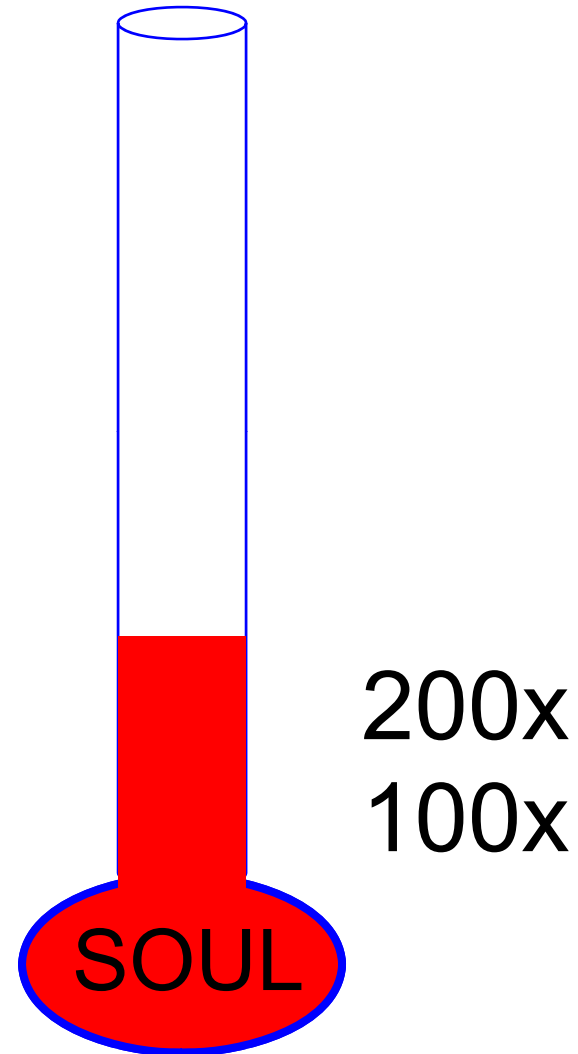
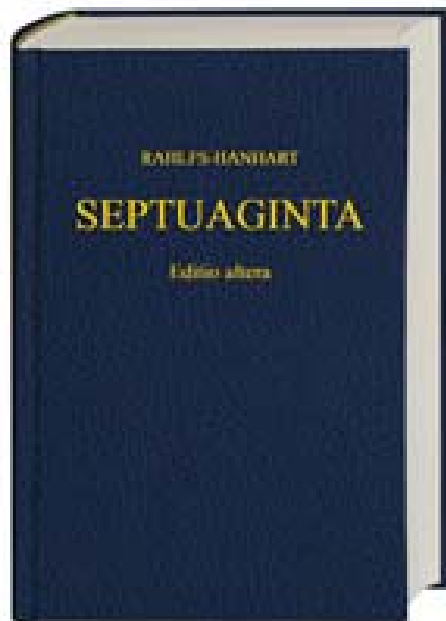
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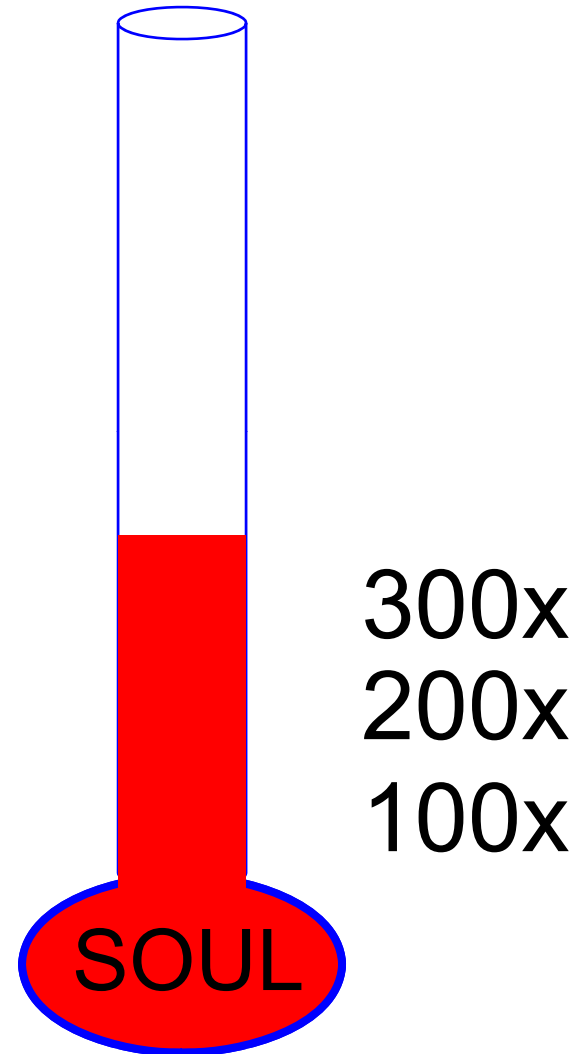
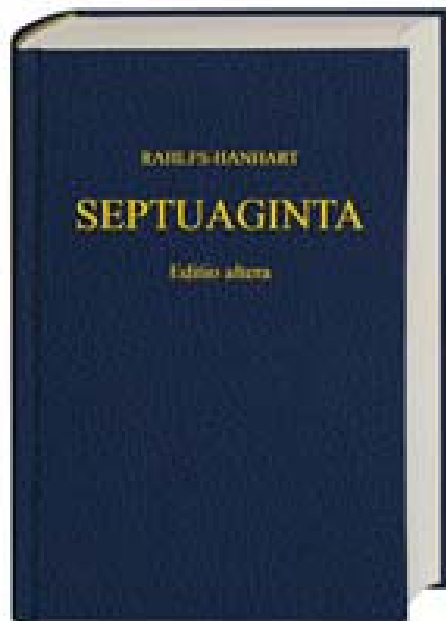
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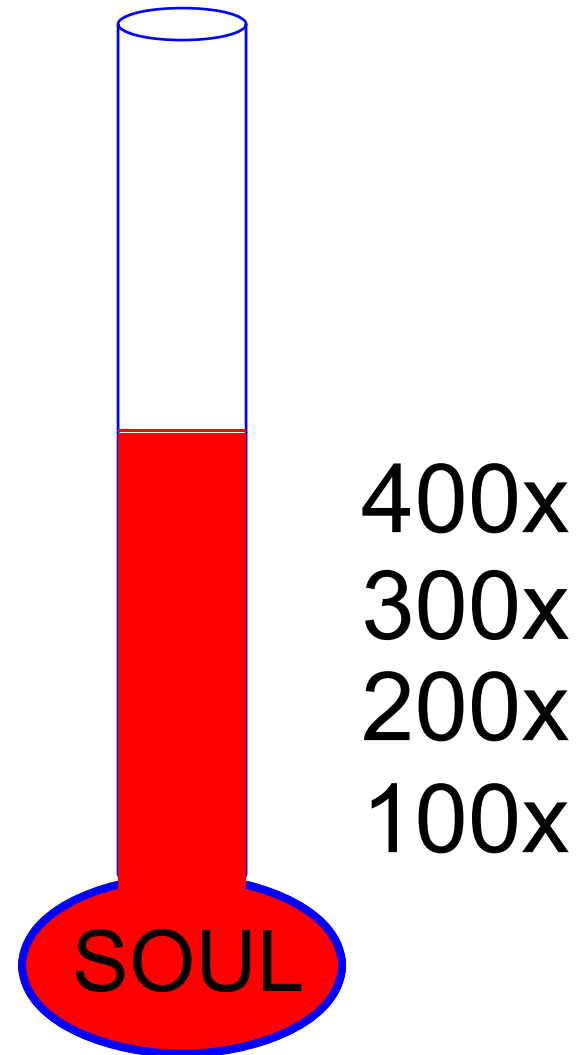
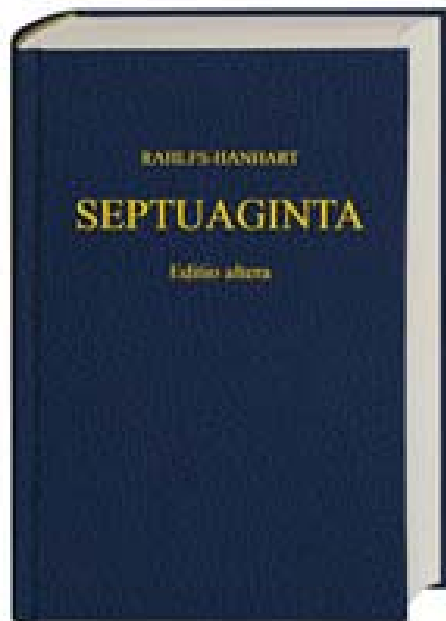
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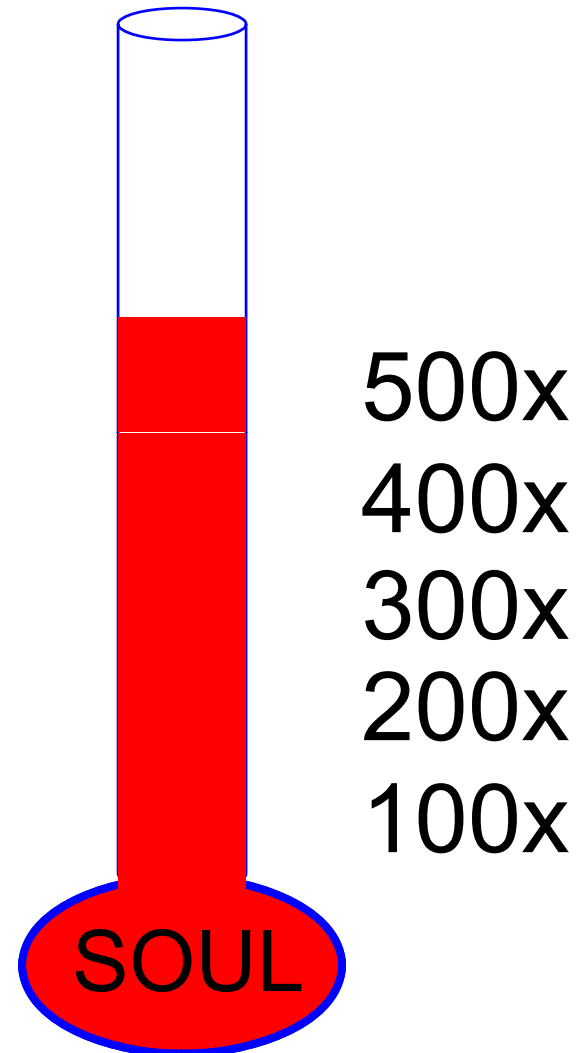
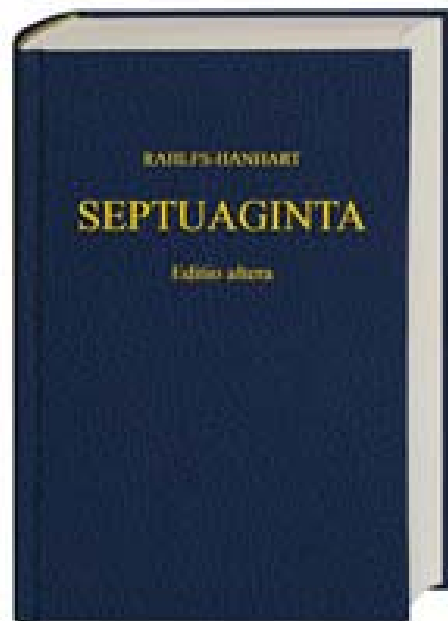
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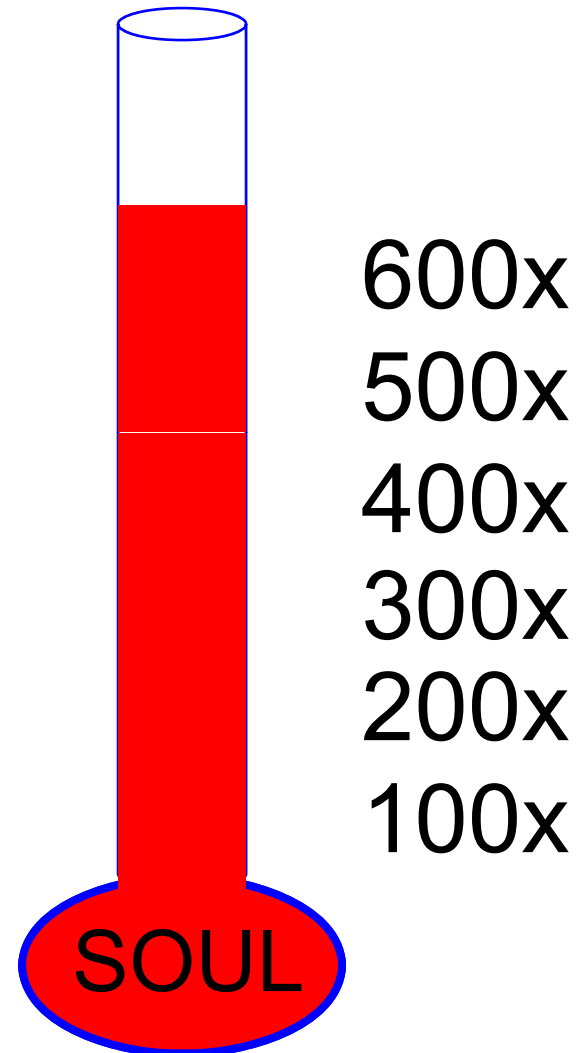
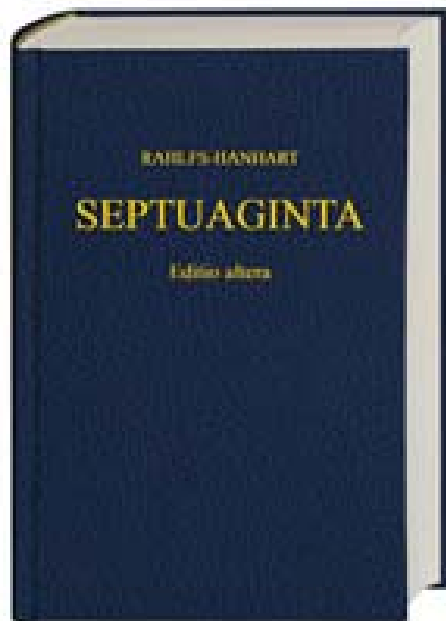
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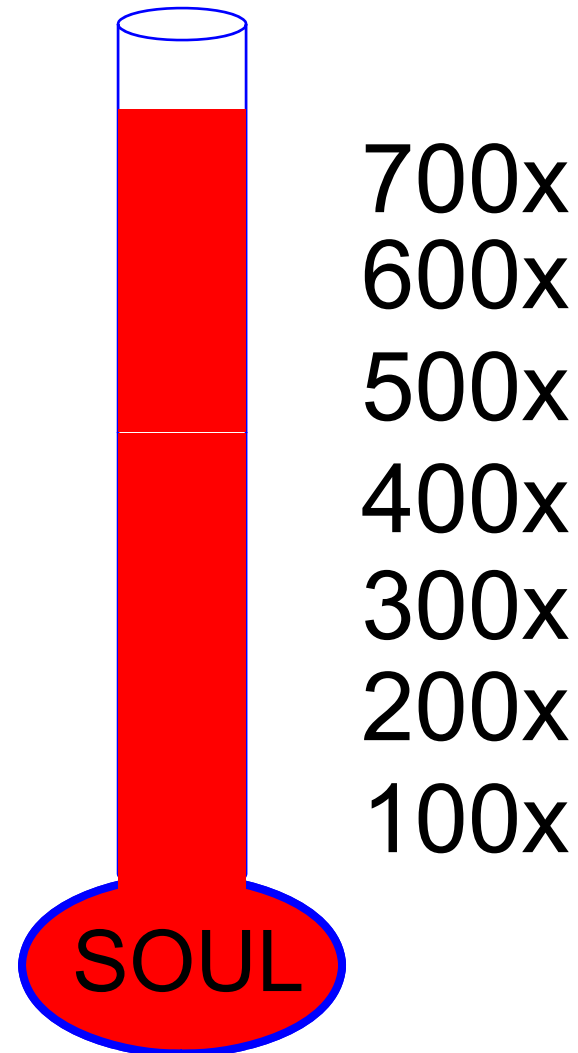
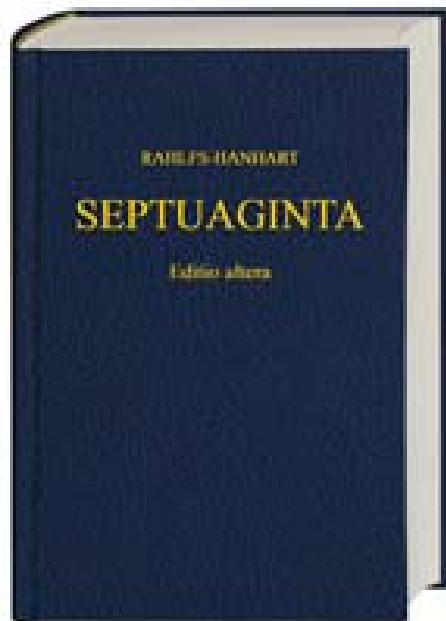
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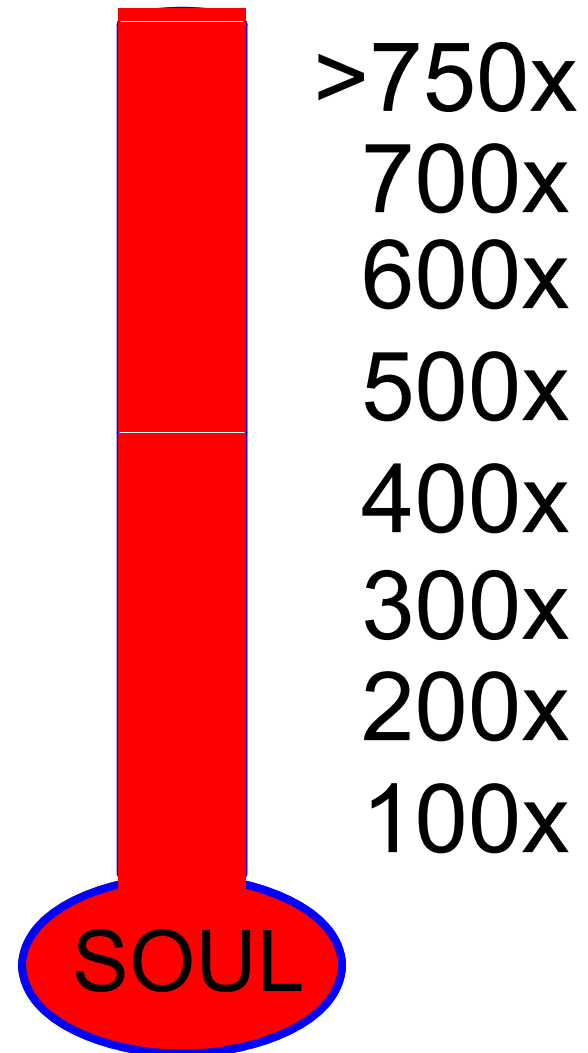
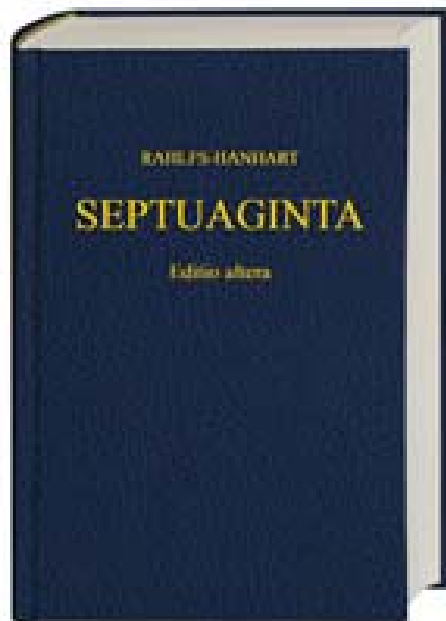
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
The Septuagint (“LXX”)
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“soul” (*psuche*) is used to translate
“nephesh” (Heb. “soul”)
and occasionally Hebrew for “spirit”
(*ruach*) and “heart” (*lev*)

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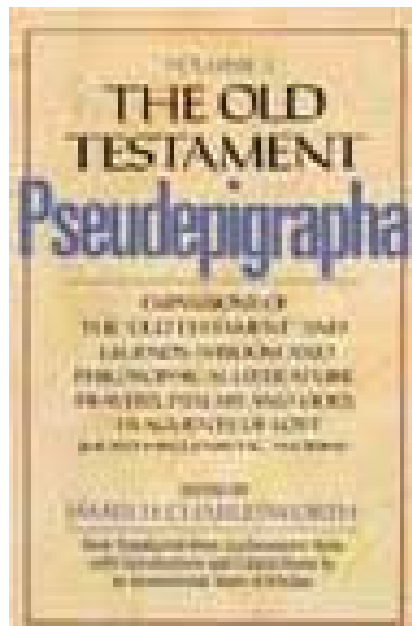
Consider Gen. 2:7 and Dt. 12:20



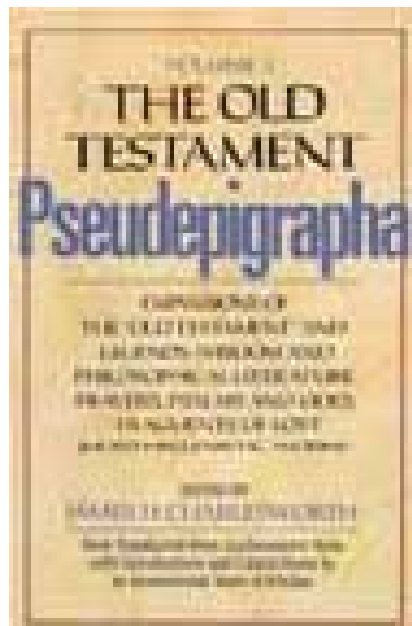
The Old Testament speaks of the human as a singular form. We are souls because we are living beings. We have desires and a will because we are alive, we are “souls.”
