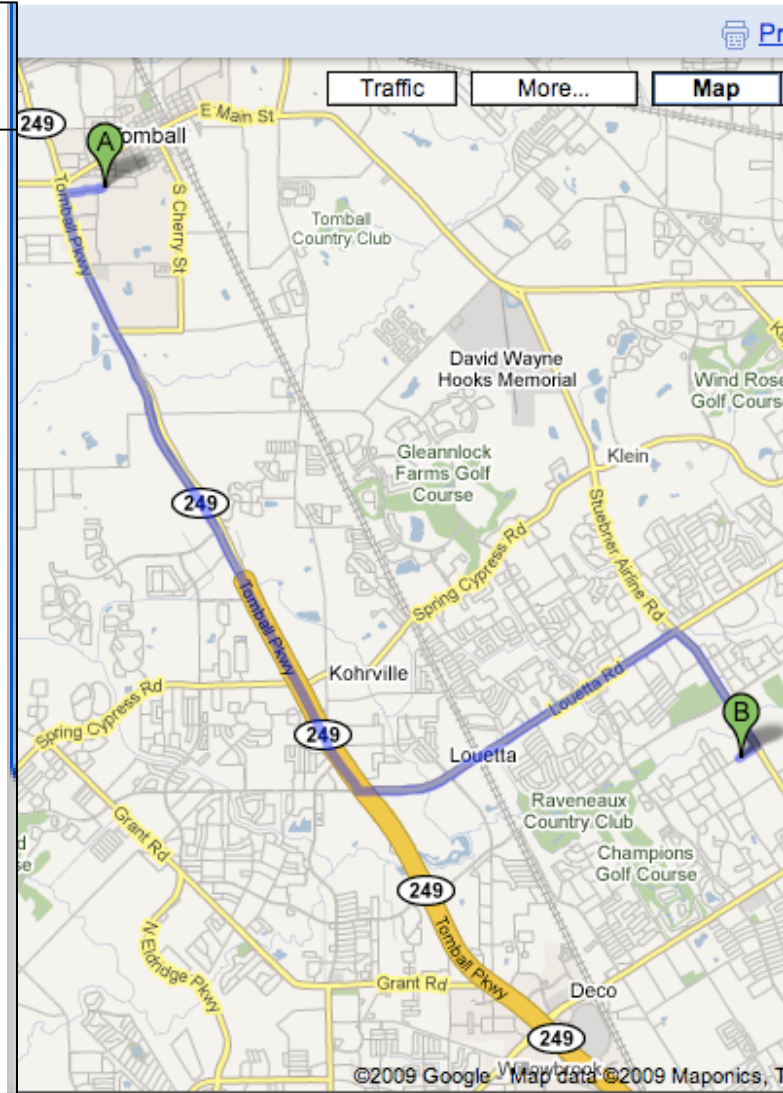


Paul combined Scriptures like we give directions!

Driving directions to Strack Rd

13.0 mi – about 23 mins

1. Head **west** on **Graham Dr** toward **Lawrence St**  0.4 mi
2. Turn **left** at **FM-149/W Montgomery Rd/ Tomball Pkwy/TX-249**  6.2 mi
Continue to follow Tomball Pkwy/TX-249
3. Take the exit toward **Jones Rd/Louetta Rd**  0.3 mi
4. Merge onto **Tomball Pkwy/TX-249** 0.5 mi
5. Continue straight to stay on **Tomball Pkwy/ TX-249** 361 ft
6. Turn **left** at **Louetta Rd**  3.8 mi

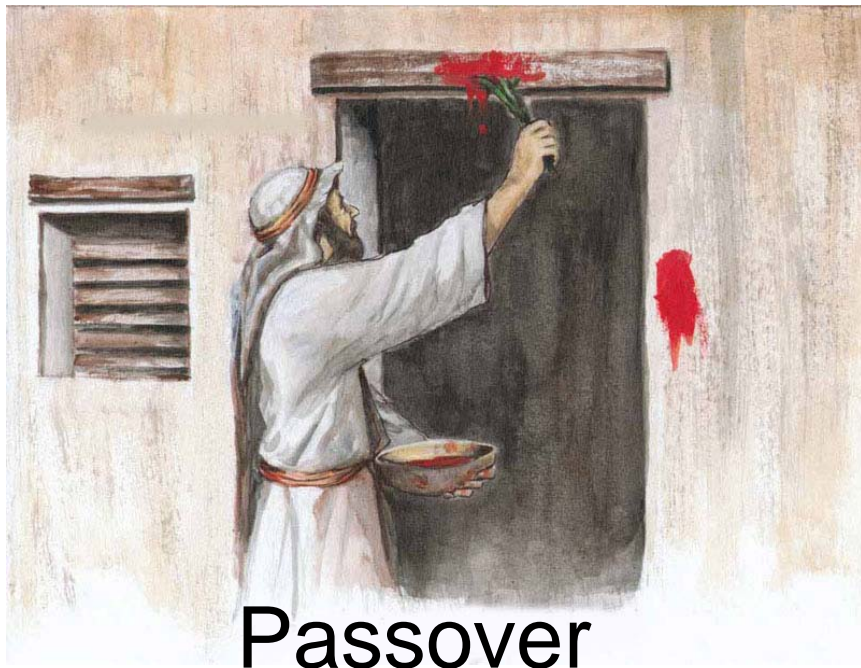


“Typology” – Something in Old Testament is a type or model of something in the New Testament



Typology ("model")

"Therefore let no one pass judgment on you ... with regard to a festival ... These are a shadow of the things to come, but the substance belongs to Christ" (Col. 2:16-17)

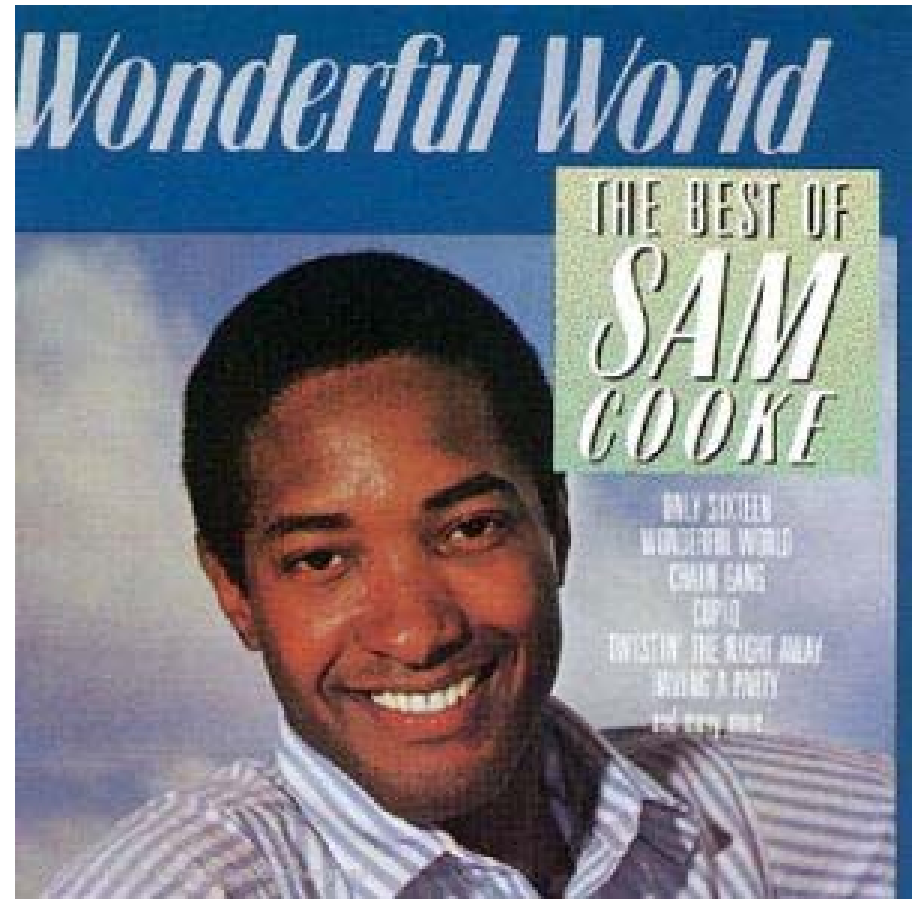
"Yet death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sinning was not like the transgression of Adam, who was a type of the one to come"

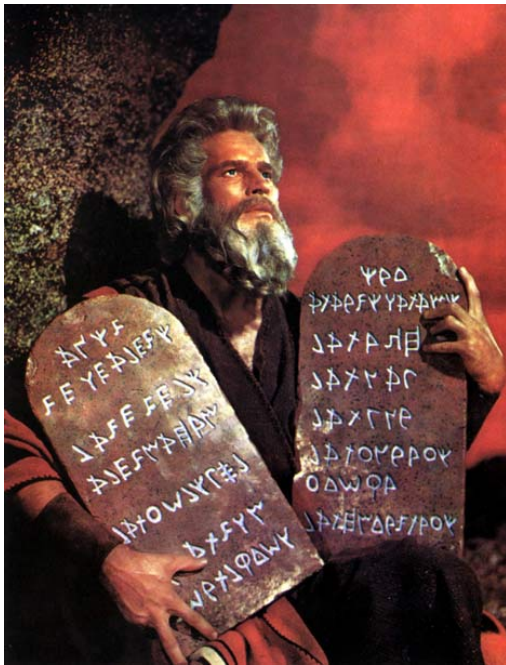

Analogy ("compare")

For Moses writes about the righteousness that is based on the law... But the righteousness based on faith says, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down) or "'Who will descend into the abyss?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. (Rom 10)
