- Jesus died March 25 (Spring equinox) or April 6

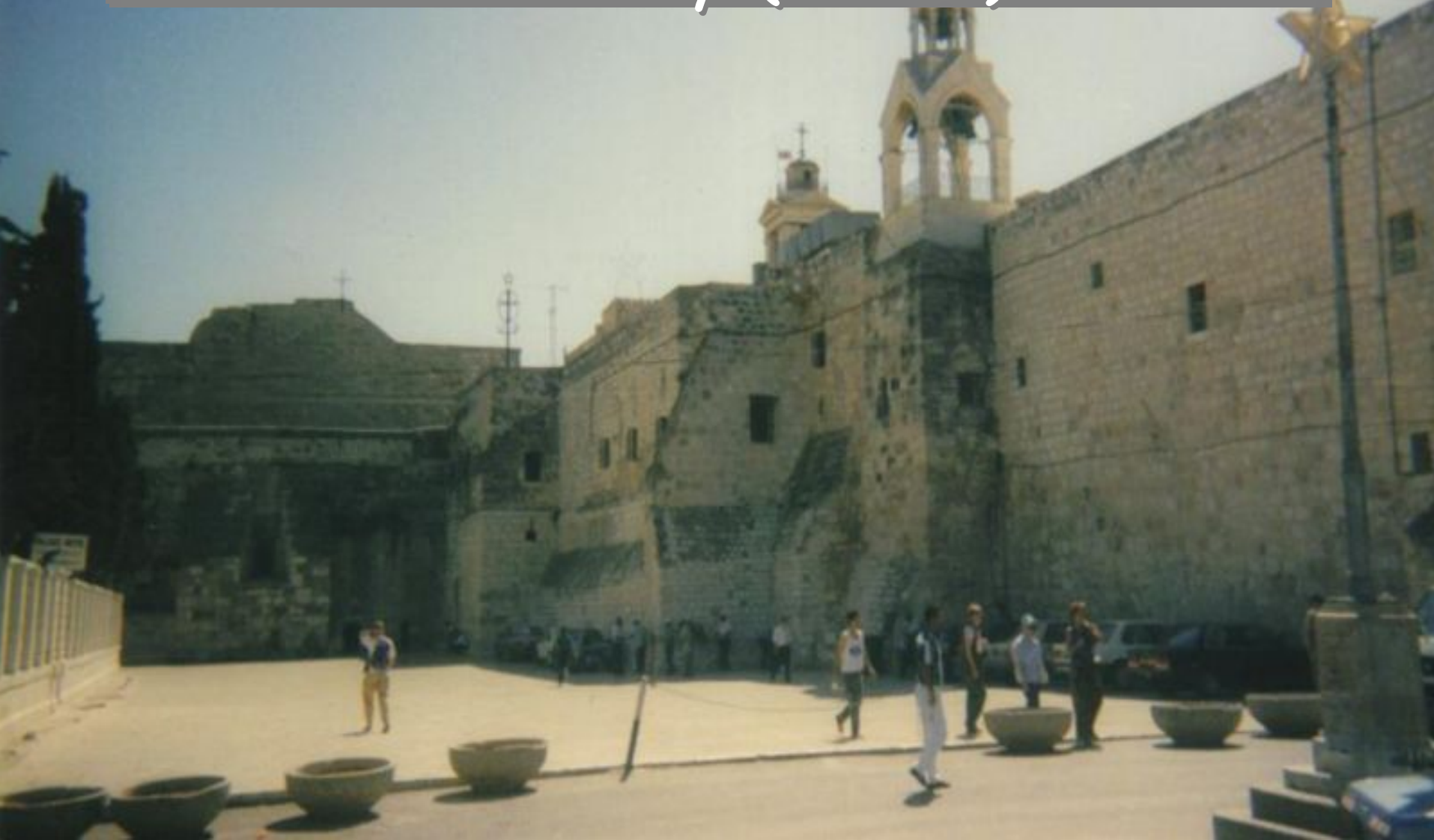

“Bethlehem this day resembles heaven. It hears from the stars the singing of angelic voices, and in the place of the sun it enfolds itself on every side with the Sun of Righteousness. And ask not how this can happen, for where God wills, the order of nature yields. For he willed, he had the power, he descended, he redeemed... This day He Who Is, is born; and He Who Is becomes what he was not. For he was God and became Man, yet not departing from the divinity that is his.”
