How Do we Know Luke Wrote It?

- No Photo
- But Lots of History
 - Justin Martyr 100ish (Multiple Quotes)
 - Irenaeus (115 to 190)
 - “Luke, the follower of Paul, preserved in a book the gospel which that apostle preached.”
 - “We” plus Paul’s Writings

When Was It Written?

- 60 A.D. By Ending of Acts
 - Post 70 by skeptics
- “When you see Jerusalem being surrounded by armies, you will know that its desolation is near.” Lk 21:20

Why Was It Written?

- One of Two to Theophilus

“I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning, it seemed good also to me to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught.”

Lk 1:3-4

Why Was It Written?

- One of Two to Theophilus
- Gospel to the Greeks

What Are the Main Points?

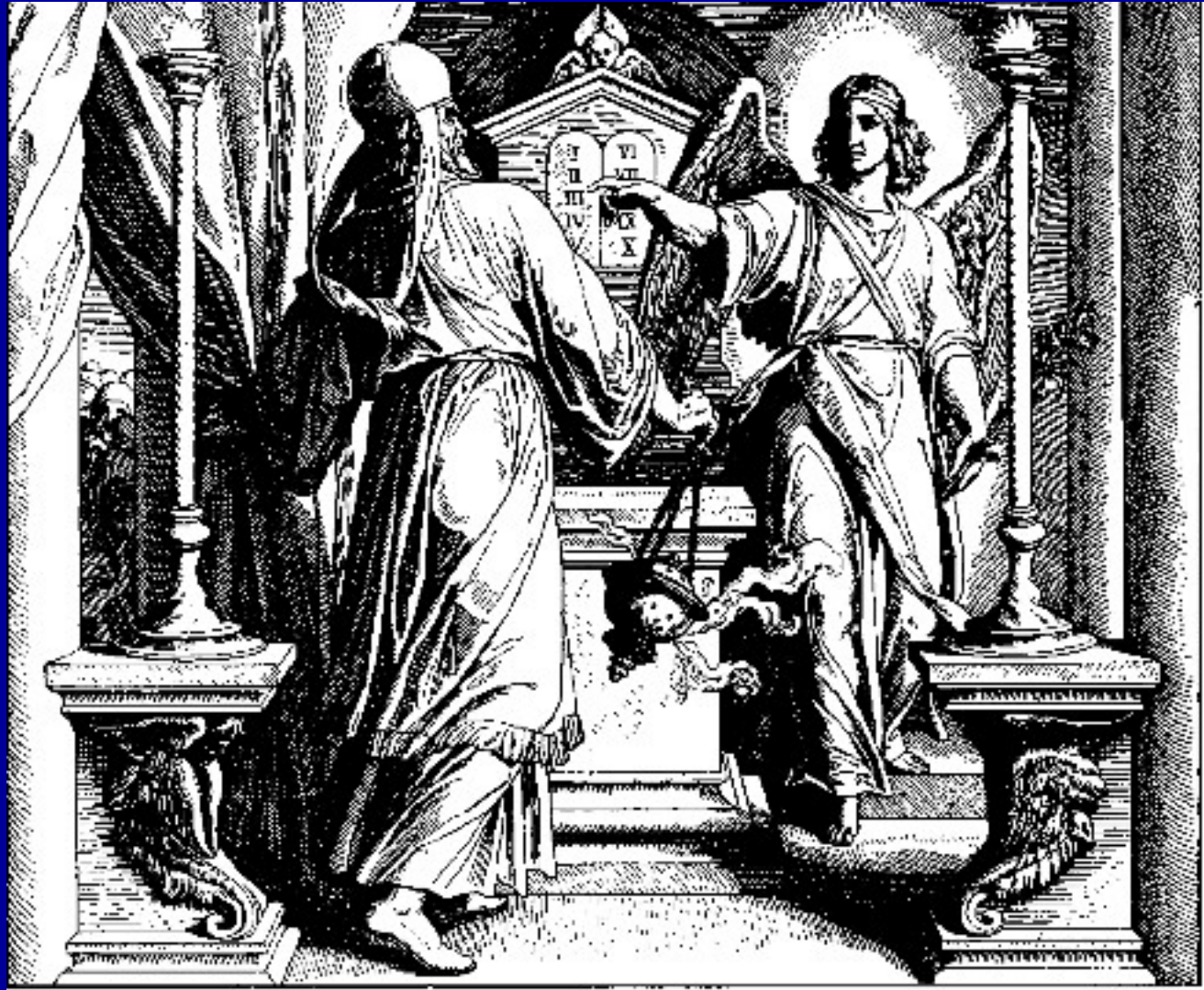
- Small Village to World Capital

Story

- Annunciation
- Visitation (*Magnificat*)
 - Birth of John the Baptist (*Benedictus*)
- Nativity (Glory to God in the Highest)
 - “I bring good news of great joy that will be for all people.” (2:10)
- Presentation
 - Simeon (*Nunc Dimittis*) / Anna
- Finding in Temple

“And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and
in favor with God and men.”

Lk 2:52

Meanwhile

- John the Baptist
 - Preaches a Baptism of Repentance
 - Isaiah's Voice in the Wilderness
 - Baptism of Jesus
 - “my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased” (3:22)
- Genealogy to Adam

Part I - Summary
