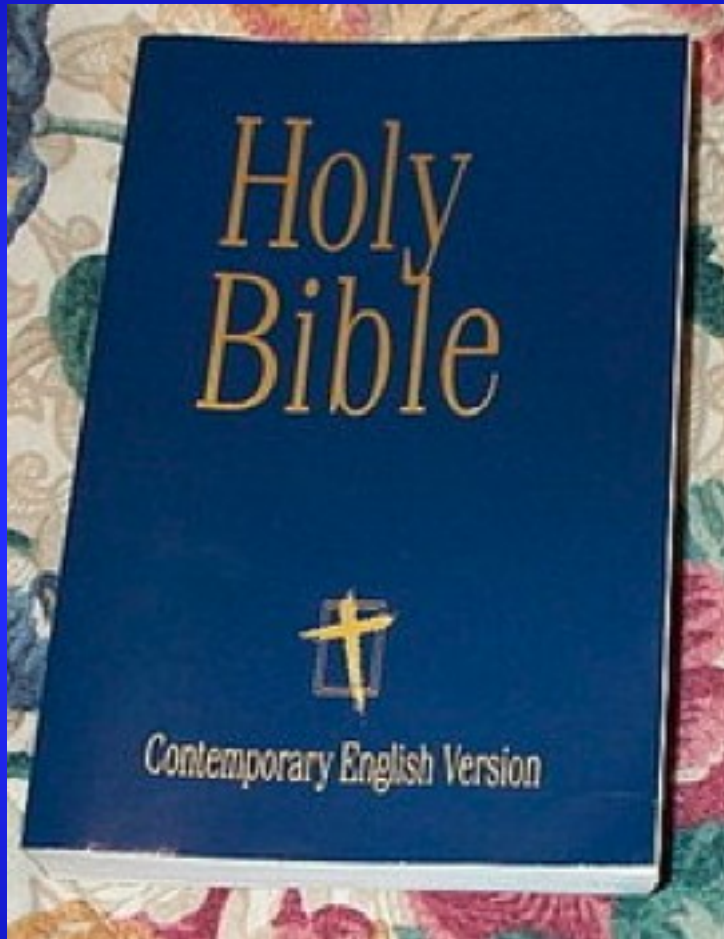
Question 2
